Mr. Barr submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Establishing the Joint Select Committee on the Events and Activities Surrounding China's Handling of the 2019 Novel Coronavirus.

- 1 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
- 2 concurring),
- 3 SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT.
- 4 There is hereby established in the Senate and the
- 5 House of Representatives a joint select committee to be
- 6 known as the "Joint Select Committee on the Events and
- 7 Activities Surrounding China's Handling of the 2019
- 8 Novel Coronavirus" (hereafter referred to as the "Joint
- 9 Select Committee").

1 SEC. 2. MEMBERSHIP.

2	(a) Selection and Appointment.—
3	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Joint Select Committee
4	shall be composed of 20 Members of the House of
5	Representatives and Senate, of whom—
6	(A) 10 shall be Members of the House of
7	Representatives, of whom 5 shall be appointed
8	by the Speaker of the House of Representatives
9	and 5 shall be appointed by the minority leader
10	of the House of Representatives; and
11	(B) 10 shall be Senators, of whom 5 shall
12	be appointed by the majority leader of the Sen-
13	ate and 5 shall be appointed by the minority
14	leader of the Senate.
15	(2) Treatment of delegate and resident
16	COMMISSIONER.—For purposes of this section, a
17	"Member" of the House of Representatives includes
18	a Delegate or Resident Commissioner to the Con-
19	gress.
20	(b) Co-chairs.—Two of the members of the Joint
21	Select Committee shall serve as co-chairs of the Joint Se-
22	lect Committee, and shall be appointed as follows:
23	(1) One shall be a Member of the House of
24	Representatives, who shall be appointed as co-chair
25	by the Speaker of the House of Representatives in

- 1 consultation with the minority leader of the House 2 of Representatives.
- 3 (2) One shall be a Senator, who shall be ap-
- 4 pointed as co-chair by the majority leader of the
- 5 Senate in consultation with the minority leader of
- 6 the Senate.
- 7 (c) VACANCIES.—A vacancy in the membership of the
- 8 Joint Select Committee (including a vacancy resulting be-
- 9 cause a member ceases to be a Member of the House of
- 10 Representatives or a Senator) shall not affect its powers,
- 11 and shall be filled not later than 14 calendar days after
- 12 the date on which the vacancy occurs in the same manner
- 13 as the original appointment was made.
- 14 (d) Deadlines.—Members of the Joint Select Com-
- 15 mittee and the co-chairs of the Joint Select Committee
- 16 shall be appointed not later than 14 calendar days after
- 17 the date of the adoption of this concurrent resolution.
- 18 SEC. 3. INVESTIGATION AND REPORT ON THE EVENTS SUR-
- 19 ROUNDING CHINA'S HANDLING OF THE 2019
- 20 NOVEL CORONAVIRUS.
- 21 (a) Investigation and Report.—The Joint Select
- 22 Committee is authorized and directed to conduct a full and
- 23 complete investigation of, and to issue a final report to
- 24 the House of Representatives and Senate regarding, the
- 25 following:

- 1 (1) The origins and causes of the 2019 novel coronavirus.
 - (2) All policies, decisions, and activities by China regarding the origins and causes of such coronavirus.
 - (3) All policies, decisions, and activities by China in response to the initial outbreak and spread of such coronavirus.
 - (4) All policies, decisions, and activities by China to suppress facts and information regarding the spread, origins, causes, and transmission of such coronavirus, including efforts to silence those making early warnings, punish whistleblowers, and restrict freedom of information about such coronavirus.
 - (5) All policies, decisions, and activities by China to spread misinformation regarding the origins and causes of such coronavirus, including accusations and misinformation that the coronavirus was brought to the city of Wuhan by the United States military.
 - (6) All policies, decisions, and activities by China to sideline, deny, and suppress charitable service organizations, institutions of civil society, secular and faith-based non-governmental organiza-

- tions, international humanitarian organizations, and foreign governments offering to provide information, expertise, resources, and assistance to China and the Chinese people to combat such coronavirus.
 - (7) Accountability for policies, decisions and activities related to influencing the World Health Organization's response to the outbreak of such coronavirus, including individuals and entities responsible for those policies, decisions, and activities.
 - (8) All policies, decisions, and activities by China to manufacture, produce, procure, possess, or hoard personal protective equipment and critical pharmaceutical components to manipulate or weaponize the supply chain against the international community, including the United States.
 - (9) Vulnerabilities in the United States domestic and global supply chain to combat a global pandemic due to reliance on Chinese manufacturing and recommendations for decreasing dependence on Chinese manufacturing by improving and securing a domestic supply chain for antibiotics, viral drugs, critical pharmaceutical components, masks, and other personal protective equipment.
 - (10) Information related to lessons learned from China's handling of such coronavirus.

- 1 (11) Any other relevant issues relating to Chi-
- 2 na's actions that led to further spread of such
- 3 coronavirus, China's response to such coronavirus,
- 4 or the investigation by the Joint Select Committee
- 5 into China regarding such coronavirus.
- 6 (12) Any recommendations to Congress and the
- 7 executive branch regarding actions the United States
- 8 government should take in response to China's han-
- 9 dling of such coronavirus.
- 10 (b) Transfer of Records.—At the request of the
- 11 co-chairs of the Joint Select Committee, any standing
- 12 committee of the Senate or House of Representatives hav-
- 13 ing custody of records in any form relating to the matters
- 14 described in subsection (a) shall transfer such records to
- 15 the Joint Select Committee.
- 16 (c) Interim Reports.—In addition to the final re-
- 17 port issued under subsection (a), the Joint Select Com-
- 18 mittee may issue such interim reports as it considers nec-
- 19 essary.
- 20 (d) Classified Annex.—The Joint Select Com-
- 21 mittee may include a classified annex in any report issued
- 22 under this section.
- (e) Definitions.—

1	(1) China.—In this section, the term "China"
2	means the Government of the People's Republic of
3	China and any of the following:
4	(A) An official of the Chinese Communist
5	Party.
6	(B) An official of the Government of the
7	People's Republic of China.
8	(C) An agent or instrumentality of the
9	Government of the People's Republic of China.
10	(D) Any other person owned or controlled
11	by or acting on behalf of any person described
12	in subparagraphs (A) through (C).
13	(2) 2019 NOVEL CORONAVIRUS.—In this sub-
14	section, the term "2019 novel coronavirus" means
15	the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) and severe
16	acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-
17	CoV-2).
18	SEC. 4. POWERS.
19	(a) Hearings and Other Activities.—For the
20	purpose of carrying out its duties, the Joint Select Com-
21	mittee may hold such hearings and undertake such other
22	activities as the Joint Select Committee determines to be
23	necessary to carry out its duties, whether the Congress
24	is in session, has recessed, or has adjourned.

- 1 (b) AUTHORITY TO USE SUBPOENAS.—The Joint Se-
- 2 lect Committee may require by subpoena the attendance
- 3 of such witnesses and the production of such books, pa-
- 4 pers, and documents, as it considers appropriate.
- 5 (c) Access to Legislative Branch Services.—
- 6 The Joint Select Committee shall have access to the serv-
- 7 ices of the Government Accountability Office, the Congres-
- 8 sional Budget Office, and the Congressional Research
- 9 Service in the same manner and under the same terms
- 10 and conditions as any standing committee of the House
- 11 of Representatives or Senate.
- 12 (d) Adoption of Rules.—Not later than 7 days
- 13 after all of its members have been appointed, the Joint
- 14 Select Committee shall adopt rules governing its oper-
- 15 ations, including rules governing the issuance of sub-
- 16 poenas and rules governing the use of official funds for
- 17 travel by members and staff, and shall submit such rules
- 18 to the Clerk of the House of Representatives and Sec-
- 19 retary of the Senate for publication in the Congressional
- 20 Record.
- 21 SEC. 5. STAFF; FUNDING.
- 22 (a) Staff.—
- 23 (1) Use of existing staff.—To the greatest
- extent practicable, the Joint Select Committee shall

utilize the services of staff of employing offices of
the Senate and House of Representatives.

(2) Authority to appoint staff.—

- (A) IN GENERAL.—Each of the co-chairs of the Joint Select Committee may appoint, prescribe the duties and responsibilities of, and fix the pay of such staff as the co-chair considers appropriate to assist the Joint Select Committee in carrying out its duties, so long as the number of staff appointed by one of the co-chairs does not exceed the number of staff appointed by the other co-chair.
- (B) Detail of congressional employ-EES.—Upon the joint request of the co-chairs, the head of an employing office of the House of Representatives or Senate (including a joint committee of the Congress) is authorized to detail, without reimbursement, any of the staff of the office to the Joint Select Committee to assist the Joint Select Committee in carrying out its duties.
- (3) EXPERTS AND CONSULTANTS.—Section 202(i) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 4301(i)) shall apply with respect to the Joint Select Committee in the same manner as such

section applies with respect to a standing committee

of the Senate, except that any consultant whose

services are procured by the Joint Select Committee

shall be selected jointly by the co-chairs of the Joint

Select Committee.

(b) Funding.—

- (1) Vouchers.—Payments for expenses of the Joint Select Committee shall be made using vouchers authorized by the Joint Select Committee, signed by co-chairs of the Joint Select Committee, and approved in a manner directed by the Committee on Rules and Administration of the Senate and the Committee on House Administration of the House of Representatives.
- (2) Source of funds.—There are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be necessary for the operation of the Joint Select Committee, of which—
- (A) 50 percent shall be derived from the applicable accounts of the House of Representatives; and
- 22 (B) 50 percent shall be derived from the contingent fund of the Senate.

1 SEC. 6. TERMINATION.

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2	(a) TERMINATION DATE.—The Joint Select Com-
3	mittee shall terminate 30 days after filing the final report
4	required under section 3.
5	(b) Transfer of Records.—Upon termination of
6	the Joint Select Committee, the records of the Joint Select
7	Committee shall be transferred to—
8	(1) such committee or committees of the House
9	of Representatives as may be designated by the
10	Speaker of the House of Representatives; and
11	(2) such committee or committees of the Senate
12	as my be designated by the President pro tempore

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
