# H. R. 4942

To direct the Transportation Security Administration to develop and disseminate best practices for rental companies and dealers to report suspicious behavior to law enforcement agencies at the point of sale of a covered rental vehicle to prevent and mitigate acts of terrorism using motor vehicles, and for other purposes.

Mr. Gottheimer (for himself and Mr. Fitzpatrick) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Homeland Security

## A BILL

To direct the Transportation Security Administration to develop and disseminate best practices for rental companies and dealers to report suspicious behavior to law enforcement agencies at the point of sale of a covered rental vehicle to prevent and mitigate acts of terrorism using motor vehicles, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Darren Drake Act".
- 5 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 6 Congress makes the following findings:

- 1 (1) From 2013 through 2017, terrorists carried 2 out 25 known vehicle ramming attacks in North 3 America and Western Europe, resulting in 156 fa-4 talities and 790 injuries.
  - (2) The Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant, or ISIS, was designated by the Department of State as a foreign terrorist organization on December 17, 2004, and was designated as a Specially Designated Global Terrorist (SDGT) on October 15, 2004.
  - (3) Al-Qa'ida and the Islamic State have promoted vehicle attacks for years, including in Inspire, the online magazine of al-Qa'ida and in Rumiya, the magazine of the Islamic State.
  - (4) The Islamic State calls upon its followers to conduct vehicle ramming attacks by buying, renting, stealing, or borrowing trucks and targeting large outdoor events, crowded pedestrian streets, outdoor markets and rallies.
  - (5) On November 21, 2017, a grand jury in the Southern District of New York returned a 22-count indictment against the perpetrator of an alleged vehicular terrorist attack carried out in the name of the designated foreign terrorist organization the Islamic State in lower Manhattan on October 31, 2017, which killed eight people, including Darren

- Drake of New Milford, New Jersey, and injured 12 more.
- 3 (6) On March 27, 2019, an Ohio man plead 4 guilty to 29 Federal hate crimes for driving a car 5 into a crowd of counter-protestors in Charlottesville, 6 Virginia, on August 12, 2017, killing one woman 7 and injuring dozens.
- 8 (7) The automotive sale and rental industry has 9 been a leader in strengthening security measures, 10 working with government agencies and officials in-11 cluding the Department of Homeland Security, Transportation Security Administration, and the 12 13 Federal Bureau of Investigation, and continuing to 14 innovate and improve to better protect its customers, 15 employees, assets, and the general public.

#### 16 SEC. 3. TSA BEST PRACTICES RELATED TO CERTAIN INFOR-

17 MATION COLLECTED BY RENTAL COMPANIES
18 AND DEALERS.

### (a) Development and Dissemination.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the Transportation Security Administration shall develop and disseminate best practices for rental companies and dealers to report suspicious

3	(2) Consultation; updates.—The Adminis-
4	trator of the Transportation Security Administration
5	shall develop and, as necessary, update the best
6	practices described in paragraph (1) after consulta-
7	tion with relevant rental industry stakeholders.
8	(b) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—Not later than one year
9	after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
10	of Homeland Security and the Administrator of the Trans-
11	portation Security Administration shall jointly submit to
12	Congress a report on the implementation of this section,
13	including an assessment of—
14	(1) the impact of the best practices described in
15	subsection (a) on efforts to protect the United
16	States against terrorist attacks; and
17	(2) ways to improve and expand cooperation
18	and engagement between—
19	(A) the Department of Homeland Security
20	and the Transportation Security Administra-
21	tion; and
22	(B) rental companies, dealers, and other
23	relevant rental industry stakeholders.
24	(c) Definitions.—In this section, the terms "cov-
25	ered rental vehicle", "dealer", and "rental company" have

- 2 49, United States Code.
