3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Net Neutrality and5 Broadband Justice Act of 2022".

1	SEC. 2. CLASSIFICATION OF BROADBAND AS TELE-
2	COMMUNICATIONS SERVICE.
3	Section $3(53)$ of the Communications Act of 1934
4	(47 U.S.C. 153(53)) is amended—
5	(1) by striking "means the offering" and insert-
6	ing the following: "—
7	"(A) means the offering"; and
8	(2) by striking the period at the end and insert-
9	ing the following: "; and
10	"(B) includes the offering of broadband
11	internet access service, as defined in section
12	801, for a fee directly to the public, or to such
13	classes of users as to be effectively available di-
14	rectly to the public, regardless of the facilities
15	used.".
