4	This Act may be cited as the "Blue Water Navy Viet-
5	nam Veterans Act of 2019".
6	SEC. 2. CLARIFICATION OF PRESUMPTIONS OF EXPOSURE
7	FOR VETERANS WHO SERVED IN VICINITY OF
8	REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM.
9	(a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 11 of title 38, United
10	States Code, is amended by inserting after section 1116 the
11	following new section:
12	"§1116A. Presumptions of service connection for vet-
13	erans who served offshore of the Republic
14	of Vietnam
15	"(a) Service Connection.—For the purposes of sec-
16	tion 1110 of this title, and subject to section 1113 of this
17	title, a disease covered by section 1116 of this title becoming
18	manifest as specified in that section in a veteran who, dur-
19	ing active military, naval, or air service, served offshore
20	of the Republic of Vietnam during the period beginning on
21	January 9, 1962, and ending on May 7, 1975, shall be con-
22	sidered to have been incurred in or aggravated by such serv-
23	ice, notwithstanding that there is no record of evidence of
24	such discase during the period of such service

1 "(b) EXPOSURE.—A veteran who, during active mili-2 tary, naval, or air service, served offshore of the Republic 3 of Vietnam during the period beginning on January 9, 4 1962, and ending on May 7, 1975, shall be presumed to 5 have been exposed during such service to an herbicide agent unless there is affirmative evidence to establish that the vet-6 7 eran was not exposed to any such agent during that service. 8 "(c) EFFECTIVE DATE OF AWARD.—(1) Except as pro-9 vided by paragraph (2), the effective date of an award 10 under this section shall be determined in accordance with section 5110 of this title. 11

12 "(2)(A) Notwithstanding subsection (g) of section 5110
13 of this title, the Secretary shall determine the effective date
14 of an award based on a claim under this section for an
15 individual described in subparagraph (B) by treating the
16 date on which the individual filed the prior claim specified
17 in clause (i) of such subparagraph as the date on which
18 the individual filed the claim so awarded under this section.

19 "(B) An individual described in this subparagraph is
20 a veteran, or a survivor of a veteran, who meets the fol21 lowing criteria:

"(i) The veteran or survivor submitted a claim
for disability compensation on or after September 25,
1985, and before January 1, 2020, for a disease covered by this section, and the claim was denied by rea-
