2 Senatorial and Delegate Scholarships - Veterans <u>Individuals on Active Duty</u> 3 Eligibility, <u>Award Amounts</u>, and Use of Funds

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain senatorial and delegate scholarships to be used at $\mathbf{5}$ certain out-of-state institutions of higher education if a certain scholarship 6 applicant is a certain veteran individual on active duty who is domiciled in the State; 7 authorizing requiring a certain veteran individual on active duty to be domiciled in the State in order to retain a certain senatorial scholarship: altering the amount that 8 9 may be awarded under the senatorial scholarship program beginning on a certain date; clarifying the calculation of the amount that may be awarded under the delegate 10 11 scholarship program; making certain stylistic changes; and generally relating to

8 (b) (1) Each scholarship pays the tuition and mandatory fees at any eligible 9 institution.

10 (2) The annual amount of a scholarship at a **PUBLIC OR** private institution 11 or any graduate or professional program may not exceed the equivalent annual tuition and 12 mandatory fees of an undergraduate program at the 4-year public institution of higher 13 education within the University System of Maryland, other than the University of Maryland 14 University College and University of Maryland, Baltimore Campus, with the highest annual 15 expenses for a full-time resident undergraduate.
