### A BILL

To preserve United States fishing heritage through a national program dedicated to training and assisting the next generation of commercial fishermen. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Young Fishermen's De5 velopment Act".

### 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

7 In this Act:

8 (1) SEA GRANT INSTITUTION.—The term "Sea
9 Grant Institution" means a sea grant college or sea
10 grant institute, as those terms are defined in section
11 203 of the National Sea Grant College Program Act
12 (33 U.S.C. 1122).

(2) TRIBAL ORGANIZATION.—The term "Tribal
organization" has the meaning given the term "tribal
organization" in section 4 of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C.
5304).

18 (3) YOUNG FISHERMAN.—The term "young fish19 erman" means an individual who—

20 (A) desires to participate in the commercial
21 fisheries of the United States, including the
22 Great Lakes fisheries;

23 (B) has worked as a captain, crew member,
24 or deckhand on a commercial fishing vessel for
25 not more than 10 years of cumulative service;

1		(C)	is	a	beginning	commercial	fisherman;
2	or						

3 (D) is less than 35 years of age.

### 4 SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM.

5 The Secretary of Commerce, acting through the Na-6 tional Sea Grant Office, shall establish a program to pro-7 vide training, education, outreach, and technical assistance 8 initiatives for young fishermen, to be known as the "Young 9 Fishermen's Development Grant Program" (referred to in 10 this section as the "Program").

11 SEC. 4. GRANTS.

(a) IN GENERAL.—In carrying out the Program, the
Secretary shall make competitive grants to support new and
established local and regional training, education, outreach,
and technical assistance initiatives for young fishermen, including programs, workshops, and services relating to—

- 17 (1) seamanship, navigation, electronics, and18 safety;
- 19 (2) vessel and engine care, maintenance, and re20 pair;

21 (3) innovative conservation fishing gear engi22 neering and technology;

- 23 (4) sustainable fishing practices;
- 24 (5) entrepreneurship and good business practices;

1	(6) direct marketing, supply chain, and
2	traceability;
3	(7) financial and risk management, including
4	vessel, permit, and quota purchasing;
5	(8) State and Federal legal requirements for spe-
6	cific fisheries, including reporting, monitoring, li-
7	censes, and regulations;
8	(9) State and Federal fisheries policy and man-
9	agement;
10	(10) mentoring, apprenticeships, or internships;
11	and
12	(11) any other activities, opportunities, or pro-
13	grams, as the Secretary determines appropriate.
14	(b) ELIGIBILITY.—
15	(1) Applicants.—To be eligible to receive a
16	grant under the Program, a recipient shall be a col-
17	laborative State, Tribal, local, or regionally based
18	network or partnership of public or private entities,
19	which may include—
20	(A) a Sea Grant Institution;
21	(B) a Federal or State agency or a Tribal
22	organization;
23	(C) a community-based nongovernmental
24	organization;
25	(D) fishermen's cooperatives or associations;

1	(E) an institution of higher education (in-
2	cluding an institution awarding an associate's
3	degree), or a foundation maintained by an insti-
4	tution of higher education; or
5	(F) any other appropriate entity, as the
6	Secretary determines appropriate.
7	(2) PARTICIPANTS.—All young fishermen seeking
8	to participate in the commercial fisheries of the
9	United States and the Great Lakes are eligible to par-
10	ticipate in the activities funded through grants pro-
11	vided for in this section, except that participants in
12	such activities shall be selected by each grant recipi-
13	ent.
14	(c) Maximum Term and Amount of Grant.—
15	(1) IN GENERAL.—A grant under this section

4 this section, the Secretary shall, to the maximum extent
5 practicable, ensure geographic diversity.

6 (f) COOPERATION AND EVALUATION CRITERIA.—In
7 carrying out this section and in developing criteria for eval8 uating grant applications, the Secretary shall consult, to
9 the maximum extent practicable, with—

10 (1) Sea Grant Institutions and extension agents
11 of such institutions;

12 (2) community-based nongovernmental fishing
13 organizations;

14 (3) Federal and State agencies, including Re15 gional Fishery Management Councils established
16 under the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation
17 and Management Act (16 U.S.C. 1851 et seq.);

18 (4) institutions of higher education with fisheries
19 expertise and programs; and

20 (5) partners, as the Secretary determines.

(g) PROHIBITION.—A grant under this section may
not be used to purchase any fishing license, permit, quota,
or other harvesting right.

### 1 SEC. 5. FUNDING.

Of the amount made available to the Secretary of Commerce under section 311(e) of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (16 U.S.C. 1861(e))
for each of fiscal years 2021 through 2025, the Secretary
shall use \$2,000,000 to carry out section 4 of this Act.
