A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 14 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to education accountability assessment programs, so as to provide transparency of
- 3 financial information of local school systems and schools to the greatest extent practicable;
- 4 to provide for legislative intent; to provide for accessibility to certain financial data of a local
- 5 board of education; to provide for school level budget and expenditure data; to require local
- 6 school systems and schools to provide certain information on their websites; to provide for
- 7 certain data and reports; to amend Part 15 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official
- 8 Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to miscellaneous provisions under the "Quality Basic
- 9 Education Act," so as to provide for unique identifiers for students who are children of
- 10 military personnel; to provide a short title; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting
- 11 laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 14 Article 2 of Chapter 14 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 15 education accountability assessment programs, is amended by adding a new part to read as
- 16 follows:

- 19 The intent of this part is to provide transparency and accuracy of financial information at
- 20 <u>the local school system and school levels to the greatest extent practicable. It is the intent</u>
- of the General Assembly that local school systems and schools provide the public with
- 22 <u>ready access to all financial information not specifically made confidential by law.</u>

- 24 (a) The Department of Education shall make available on its website the following school
- 25 <u>site budget and expenditure information for each school unless specifically made</u>
- 26 <u>confidential by law:</u>
- 27 (1) The cost of all materials, equipment, and other nonstaff support;
- 28 (2) Salary and benefit expenditures for all staff;
- 29 (3) The cost of all professional development, including training, materials, and tuition
- 30 provided for instructional staff on an annual basis;
- 31 (4) The total cost of facility maintenance and small capital projects:
- 32 (5) The total expenditures of new construction or major renovation, based on the school
- 33 <u>system facility plan; and</u>
- 34 (6) The per student expenditures for each local school system and school as delineated
- in Section 1111(h)(1)(C)(x) of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as
- amended by the federal Every Student Succeeds Act.
- 37 (b) The Department of Education shall make available on its website the following school
- 38 <u>system level information:</u>
- 39 (1) The annual budget of the local board of education;
- 40 (2) Ratios of expenditures to revenues for all general and special revenue funds;
- 41 (3) The total dollar amount of local property tax revenue the school system collected in
- 42 <u>addition to the actual millage rate levied; and</u>
- 43 (4) The total dollar amount of all other tax revenue that is collected by the school system.
- 44 (c) Each local school system and each state charter school which maintains a website shall
- 45 post in a prominent location on its website a link to where the information listed in
- 46 <u>subsections (a) and (b) of this Code section and the following information can be found on</u>
- 47 <u>the Department of Education's website:</u>
- 48 (1) The annual budget submitted to the State Board of Education pursuant to

- 62 (d) Each public school which maintains a website shall post in a prominent location on its
- 63 <u>website a link to where:</u>
- 64 (1) The financial efficiency ratings for the school published by the office pursuant to
- 65 <u>Code Section 20-14-34 can be found on the office's website; and</u>
- 66 (2) The information listed in paragraphs (1) through (5) of subsection (c) of this Code
- section can be found on the Department of Education's website.

- 69 (a) No later than January 1, 2018, the State Board of Education shall develop rules and
- 70 regulations requiring that each local board of education and each state charter school
- 71 provide the information required in this part for their respective schools as specified by the

- 73 <u>budget and expenditure information</u>. Such rules and regulations shall include templates
- and definitions of budget and expenditure categories and line items as needed.

- 79 (a) The office shall report the percentage of students with each state funded characteristic
- included in Code Section 20-2-161 at the local school system and school levels.
- 81 (b) The office shall create and publish an online sortable data base for each local school
- 82 <u>system and school on per student expenditures used to determine the financial efficiency</u>
- rating calculated by the office pursuant to Code Section 20-14-33 and as delineated in
- Section 1111(h)(1)(C)(x) of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as
- amended by the federal Every Student Succeeds Act.
- 86 (c) The office shall report the relative financial performance of local school systems and
- 87 <u>schools.</u>
- 88 (d) The Department of Education shall publish annually on its website all underlying fiscal
- 89 <u>data that inform the financial efficiency rating calculated by the office pursuant to Code</u>
- 90 Section 20-14-33 and an explanation of the fiscal data that inform the financial efficiency
- 91 rating on a disaggregated basis.
- 92 (e) All state and local government entities, including the Department of Education,
- 93 <u>Department of Audits and Accounts, Office of Planning and Budget, the office, and local</u>
- 94 school systems shall cooperate with and assist each other in complying with this part."

- 100 (a) This Code section shall be known and may be cited as the 'Educating Children of
- 101 Military Families Act.'
- 102 (b) The Department of Education is authorized to establish a unique identifier for each
- 103 <u>student:</u>
- (1) Whose parent or guardian is an active duty military service member in the armed
- forces of the United States; and
- 106 (2) Whose parent is a member of a reserve component of the armed forces of the United
- 107 <u>States or the National Guard</u>
- in a manner that will allow for disaggregation of data for each category."
