A BILL

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to treat obligations financing professional sports stadiums as private activity bonds if such obligations meet the private business use test.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Eliminating Federal
- 5 Tax Subsidies for Stadiums Act of 2017".

1	SEC. 2. ELIMINATING FEDERAL TAX SUBSIDIZATION OF
2	PROFESSIONAL SPORTS STADIUMS.
3	(a) Treatment of Certain Obligations Financ-
4	ING PROFESSIONAL SPORTS STADIUMS AS PRIVATE AC-
5	TIVITY BONDS.—Section 141(b) of the Internal Revenue
6	Code of 1986 is amended by adding at the end the fol-
7	lowing new paragraph:
8	"(10) Special rule for professional
9	SPORTS STADIUMS.—
10	"(A) In General.—In the case of any
11	issue any proceeds of which are to be used to
12	provide a professional sports stadium, such
13	issue shall be treated as meeting the private se-
14	curity or payment test of paragraph (2).
15	"(B) Professional sports stadium.—
16	For purposes of this paragraph, the term 'pro-
17	fessional sports stadium' means any facility
18	(and appurtenant real property) which, during
19	at least 5 days during any calendar year, is
20	used as a stadium or arena for professional
21	sports exhibitions, games, or training.".
22	(b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
23	this section shall apply to obligations issued after the date
24	of the enactment of this Act.
