## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the administration of government; 2 recognizing limitations on the regulatory authority of the 3 occupational safety and health administration; providing 4 legislative findings in relation to those limitations;

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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13 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-14-102(a) by creating a new

14 paragraph (iv), by amending and renumbering (iv) as (v),

15 (b) and (c) is amended to read:

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2	9-14-102. Unauthorized federal agency actions.
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4	(a) The legislature finds:
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6	(iv) The federal occupational safety and health
7	administration has expanded its regulation of highly
8	hazardous chemicals on questionable authority;
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10	(iv) (v) When rulemaking and other actions of the
11	federal environmental protection agency or the federal
12	occupational safety and health administration rest on
13	questionable congressional authority the state is
14	authorized to protect its interests and the interests of
15	its citizens and should challenge those actions, including
16	unlawful rulemaking.
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18	(b) The legislature declares it is the state's policy
19	to vigorously defend its interests and those of its
20	citizens against rulemaking and other actions of the
21	federal environmental protection agency or the federal
22	occupational safety and health administration which are not

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1 authorized by the United States congress or which rest upon 2 questionable authority.

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4 (c) The attorney general may seek to take action before the federal environmental protection agency, the 5 federal occupational safety and health administration or in 6 any state or federal court to stop the enforcement, 7 8 administration or implementation of rulemaking or other 9 actions taken by that agency those agencies if, in his 10 judgment, the rulemaking or other action exceeds the 11 authority granted by the United States congress or 12 otherwise rests on questionable authority. Before intervening in or initiating any lawsuit pursuant to this 13 14 section, the attorney general shall obtain the approval of 15 the governor.

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Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
