17 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before December 31, 18 2021, the Board of Public Works and the Governor's Grants Office shall jointly report to the 19 General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, on the 20 implementation of this Act.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial members appointed to the Maryland Efficient Grant Application Council by the Governor shall expire as follows:

- 24 (1) two members in 2022; and
- 25 (2) two members in 2024.

26 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 27 1, 2020.
