A BILL

To provide additional criteria to deny admission to the United States for certain persons affiliated with the United Nations, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “No Place for Propa-
5 ganda Act of 2020”.

1 **SEC. 2. VISA LIMITATION FOR CERTAIN REPRESENTATIVES**
2 **TO THE UNITED NATIONS AND PARTICIPANTS**
3 **IN UNITED NATIONS ACTIVITIES.**

4 Section 407(a) of the Foreign Relations Authoriza-
5 tion Act, Fiscal Years 1990 and 1991 (8 U.S.C. 1102
6 note) is amended—

7 (1) in the matter preceding paragraph (1), by
8 inserting “or participant in activities of” after “rep-
9 resentative to”;

10 (2) in paragraph (1), by striking “(1) has been
11 found” and inserting “(1)(A) has been found”;

12 (3) by striking the period at the end of para-
13 graph (2) and inserting “; or”;

14 (4) by redesignating paragraph (2), as so
15 amended, as subparagraph (B) and moving such
16 subparagraph, as so redesignated, 2 ems to the
17 right; and

18 (5) by adding at the end the following:

19 “(2) based on credible evidence, has, in the ca-
20 pacity of such person as an official, agent, or instru-
21 mentality of the government of a country, delib-
22 erately concealed or distorted information on a seri-
23 ous, unusual, or unexpected public health risk to
24 other countries that—

25 “(A) relates to the international spread of
26 disease; or

1 “(B) carries implications for public health
2 in a manner that potentially requires a coordi-
3 nated international response or immediate
4 international action.”.
